

Seven Habits of Highly Effective Birders

- 1) Where are we? County, sub-county...
- 2) When are we? Season, month, ½ month...
- 3) Where is he? Habitat, micro-habitat...

- GISS & Structure posture, behavior, primary extension ...
- 5) Bill & Head length, shape, thickness, use...
- 6) Field Marks plumage, pattern, behavior..
- 7) <u>Diagnostic</u> Field Marks –

RESULTS IN A DIAGNOSIS!!!

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WITH FLYCATCHERS? ADDITIONAL

- ▶1st Vocalizations!!!!
- ▶2nd Get pix if possible.
- ▶3rd Depends on genus Figure out genus.


Texas Empids








FLYCATCHER TOPOGRAPHY














TOPOLOGY OF A FLYCATCHER
